Institute Of Rural Development and Education (IRDE)

Activities Of The Institute During The Last 3 Years i.e. 2014-15, 2015-16 And 2016-17

I. Introduction : About The Institute

Institute of Rural Development and Education (IRDE) is a Non Governmental Organisation (NGO), founded by Dr. V. V. Ghanekar (M.Com. Ph.D., Economics) under the guidance of late Dr. Dhananjayrao Gadgil, Dr. M R. Dhekane and Dr. P. V. Sukhatme in the year 1980, registered vide no. F2141 (Pune) on 6th July 1982 under the Bombay Public Trust Act 1950.

The Institute is also affiliated to Extra Mural Studies, Bahishal Shikshan Mandal of Savitribai Phule Pune Vidyapeeth, Pune for the last 15 years for distance informal education, to School / College students, adults, senior citizens, farmers, educated unemployeeds and women, for their physical, mental, educational , economic, psychological, social and internal development.

On behalf of Bahishal Shikshan Mandal the Institute is required to arrange every year lecture series of 3 days each in the name of late Yeshwantrao Chavan, Dr. Babasaheb Jaykar and Sant Gadgebaba. The Institute is also required to organise two Shibirs of one day each in the name of Dr. Babasaheb Jaykar for School / College Students and Sant Gadgebaba for Senior Citizens. The minimum number of participants required for each lecture series of 3 days and Shibir of one day is 50. All these lectures are delivered by empaneled speakers of Pune Vidyapeeth's Bahishal Shikshan Mandal and the topics so far covered are given in Annexure I. This activity is undertaken by the Institute every year with the financial support of Bahishal Shikshan Mandal, Savitribai Phule Pune Vidyapeeth, Pune.

Annexure II list out the publications of the Institute and Annexure III throws light on future plans of the Institute with estimated budget.

II. Area Of Operation :

Its area of operation mainly is throughout India, which can be extended globally to help the farmers of other part of the world.

Shri. S. S. Giramkar has permitted the Institute to use above mentioned office address as the mailing address of the Institute. The Institute is in the process of changing it's registered address on the records of Charity Commissioner by filing change report the intimation of which will be given to you.

IV. Vision :

To improve the life of rural masses of India / Globe by ensuring them facilities for improvement of health, education, economic and social conditions by using local resources, indigenous knowledge and scientific technologies generating employment opportunities for them in rural areas so as to stop their migration to urban areas and in fact ensure reverse migration.

Further, to develop capabilities of rural youth to innovate to solve problems of rural India and scientists to find and solve the problems of Indian agriculture instead of copying from others.

V. Mission :

To concentrate on improving agricultural production, land productivity, storage and marketing capabilities for agricultural produce, rural industrialisation to remove the human drudgery and carrying research in Agriculture, optimum, utilisation of available water by adopting newer water management practices, encouraging organic farming and to supplement their income from Agriculture, to introduce activities allied to Agriculture thereby shifting the traditional Agriculture to business model and make efforts to stop farmers' suicides in Maharashtra and other parts of the Country.

VI. Aims and Objectives in Brief :

- 1) To adopt villages for their overall socio-economic development.
- 2) To make efforts for reverse migration i.e. from urban to rural by ensuring development of skills at local level and maximum use of local resources for creating employment opportunities at local level.
- 3) To focus on increasing productivity of the land and production of crop by using new techniques of Soil, Water and Crop Management.
- 4) To ensure proper implementation of State and Central Govt. all the programmes meant for rural poor and farmers and encourage them to live with dignity, take them out of depression and stop them from committing suicide.
- 5) To undertake education and research activities.
- 6) To undertake survey activities so as to identify areas for training of the farmers.
- 7) To identify research problems and immediate needs of rural areas.
- 8) To make institute a centre of excellence for rural innovations by young minds.

VII. Last 3 Years Activities :

2014-2015

- 1) Arranged 3 days Babasaheb Jaykar Lecture series for 8th to 10th class students of Bhava School, Perugate, Sadashiv Peth, Pune from 12th to 14th Dec. 2014. The number of participants were 150 every day. The speakers were Dr. Arvind Nerkar, Sow. Ujawala Kulkarni who spoke on the subjects of Technics of Communications, Technic of Anchoring and Hasyaranjan, respectively.



- 2) Arranged 3 days Sant Gadgebaba Lecture series for Senior Citizens in the premises of Geeta Dharma Mandal, Sadashiv Peth, Pune. This 3 days lecture series was arranged on 28th to 30th January 2015. Nearly 90 senior citizens



attended the lectures for 3 days. Shri. Kacheshwar Salunkhe, Shri. Subhash Rajvel and Shri. Vijaykumar Kothasthane were the speakers who spoke on the subjects of Swami Vivekananda, Living with positive attitude and journey from joint to Nuclear family, respectively.

- 3) Arranged workshop for farmers in Marathwada Region of Maharashtra in association with Mr. David Akov, Israel Consulate General on “Water Management In Dry Land Farming”.



This workshop of one day was arranged at Aurangabad city on 20th Feb. 2015 and nearly 300 farmers from all over Maharashtra possessing dry lands attended this workshop. In this workshop, Shri. Nishikant Bhalerao of Adhunik Kisan Magazine, Dr. K. T. Galande of IRDE and Mr. David Akov,

Israel Consulate General spoke on dry land farming, practices adopted in Israel to conserve water, crops requiring less water can be grown in dry land etc.

- 4) Arranged Jowar Production Programme with Drip Irrigation in Shirur Taluka of Pune Dist. Result Demonstration Plots were taken up for Jowar cultivation with Drip Irrigation. Record Production of 37 quintals per acre was taken as against 7 to 8 quintals by traditional method of cultivation. This pilot project of Jowar cultivation with drip irrigation was implemented on the farms of 60 farmers in Shirur Taluka of Pune District during October 2014 to January 2015. The farmers were explained the economics of Jowar cultivation with drip irrigation vis-a-vis Sugar cane cultivation and it was proved beyond doubt that within 3 to 4 months Jowar gave them more production, productivity and income compared to 12 months Sugarcane cultivation which is water intensive crop.




- 5) Shetkari Melawa (Farmers Meet) was arranged at village Saikheda, Taluka Dharmabad, District Nanded on the farm of Shri. Sainath Ramode where Jowar cultivation was done by Drip Irrigation.



This programme was attended by Shri. Umakant Dangat, Divisional Commissioner, Aurangabad and Dr. Vankateshwarlu, Vice Chancellor, Punjabrao Deshmukh Krishi Vidyapeeth and Konkan Krishi Vidyapeeth, Parabhani and Dapoli, respectively.

The programme was also attended by representatives of Bharateya Kisan Sangh, Maharashtra.

This field visit and Shetkari Melawa was arranged on 19th March 2015. Both Shri. Dangat and Dr. Venkatesh Warlu in their speech made a special mention that the work which their Department and University is supposed to do has been done by IRDE and Kisan Sangh and provided a good alternative to Sugarcane growers especially in the areas of Scanty rainfall. The programme was attended by 250 farmers.



- 6) Paid visit to the farms of progressive farmers at village Deolgaonraje, Tal. Dhond, Dist. Pune and Taluka Shirur, Dist. Pune.
- 7) Paid visits to village Karanjwane Tal. Shirur, Dist. Pune a village adopted by the Institute for its overall development during next 5 to 10 years. Attended its flaghosting and Gramsabha to decide developmental plan for the village.

2015-2016

- 1) Institute implemented the project of Soil Testing and distribution of soil health card for the farmers of Shirur Taluka of Pune district in April to June 2015. The project envisaged visiting the farms of the farmers, collecting the soil samples, bringing them to Pune for testing purpose in the laboratory of Zooari Agro Chemicals, getting the reports and handing over the reports to the concerned farmer alongwith advise on deficiencies in the soil, how to remove them and which crops can be taken with their water and fertiliser requirement. Accordingly, farmers gathering of Shirur Taluka was arranged in the first week of July 2015 and the reports were distributed. This programme was implemented in association with Zooari Agro Chemicals. They offered Soil Testing in their laboratory at

concessional rate of Rs. 50/- for each soil sample as against their normal rate of Rs. 150/- per sample. Around 250 soil samples were collected from 16 villages of Shirur Taluka and in the programme itself 60 farmers were given the reports and technical advise on how to correct the PH of the soil. The farmers were given technical inputs by Zooari Agro Chemicals and Institute's Agriculture Experts Dr. K. T. Galande, Dr. Popatrao Shinde and others.

- 2) This year, encouraged with the last year's performance, the Institute extended its Jowar Cultivation Programme with Drip Irrigation to other parts of Maharashtra in Latur District (100 acres), Jalna District (50 acres), Solapur District (10 acres).
- 3) Since the country and especially Maharashtra faced shortage of Tur during the year 2014-15, the Institute decided to implement Tur production programme with Drip Irrigation in the State of Maharashtra. Accordingly pilot projects were implemented for production of Tur with Drip Irrigation in some of the districts viz. Sakri Taluka of Dhule District (250 acres), Jalna District (40 acres), Miraj/Sangli District (5 acres) and Shrirampur Taluka of Ahmednagar District (4 acres).

- 4) Institute arranged felicitation programme on 4th April 2015 to honour Shri.



Mukundrao Gore for his outstanding work in socio-economic development of the people and Advocate Shri. Shivram Giramkar one of the member of the Institute for offering free of charge his office to be used as mailing address for the Institute till alternate arrangement are finalised.


- 5) Institute donated books and toys, worth Rs. 5000/- to the Primary School of Mogarwadi village, Tal. Velhe, Dist. Pune, a village situated about 40 kms away from Pune on Pune-Velhe Road, completely neglected from all angles.

- 6) Institute arranged late Yashwantrao Chavan lecture series of three days for the 8th to 10th Std. students of Bhave School, Sadashiv Peth, Pune from 23-11-2015 to 26-11-2015. The programme was attended by 150 students everyday from 8th to 10th standard. Dr, Mubin Tamboli, Dr. Navnath Tupe and Sow. Alpana Vaidya



were the speakers who spoke on the subjects of Bandychi hasyahandi, How to develop reading habit and Technic of study, respectively.

- 7) Institute arranged three days lecture series in the name of Dr. Babasaheb Jaykar in Ramanbaug high school for the students of 8th to 10th Standard from 2nd to 4th Dec. 2015. This lecture series was attended by 120 students of 8th to 10th standard everyday. Dr. Milind Kasbe, Shri. Suryakant Kulkarni and Sow. Manjiri Dhamankar were the speakers who spoke on the subjects of Read to live, Samarth Bharat and Art of speaking, respectively.



- 8) Institute arranged three days lecture series in the name of Sant Gadgebaba for Senior Citizens of Yerawada in Pune from 25-12-2015 to 27-12-2015. All the senior citizens were the members of Perna Senior Citizen's Club. Dr. Ulka Pendse, Dr. Sunanda Edke and Dr. Arun Rode spoke on the subjects of Daily routine of senior citizens, keep mind cheerful and Policies and Schemes of State and Central Govt. for Senior Citizens, respectively.






The book has been vatted by Indian Council of Agriculture Research (ICAR), New Delhi and was published in association with Uttan Krishi Sanshodhan Sanstha, Uttan, Dist. Thane.


2016-2017

- 1) Paid visits to Karanjawane village and finalised Development Programme for the village wherein the activities like desilting of Village Percolation Tank



(constructed by the Government in the draught of 1972), change in cropping pattern, rearing of local desi cows, common housing for cows, maintenance of these cows by local educated unemployed youths, establishing self help groups of village womenfolk, processing of milk and preparing milk products, selling of milk products at Ranjangaon Ganesh Temple by educated unemployed youths of the village, Onion cultivation and its processing at local level, Repairing of road from Karanjwane village to Ranjangaon (approximately 4 km), bringing / installing Cellular Phone Tower in the village for better communication, establishing library for the school of the village etc. are planned subject to availability of funds.

- 2) Institute arranged 3 days Dr. Babasaheb Jaykar Lecture series for the students of Bhave School, Pune from 28-11-2016 to 30-11-2016. Nearly 140 students of 8th, 9th and 10th standard everyday took the benefit of this lecture series. Dr. Prafulchandra Choudhary, Mrs. Ujawala Kulkarni and Shri. Ajit Apte spoke on the subjects of Hypnotism, Hasyaranjan and Shivaji Maharaj and Modern Management.



- 3) Institute arranged late Shri. Yashwantrao Chavan 3 days Lecture Series for the students of Rathi school of Mitra Mandal Education Society, Parvati, Pune from 06-12-2016 to 08-12-2016. All the 120 students everyday were from 8th to 10th Standard. The students were addressed by Shri. Anil Gunjal from S.S.C. Board on the subject "While approaching examination". Dr. Kailas Bavale from Pune University spoke on the subject of Science and Education and Dr. Arvind Nerkar spoke on the subject of Technics of communication.



- 4) Institute arranged 3 days lecture series for the Senior Citizens staying in old age home "Matoshri" near Rajaram bridge, Karvenagar, Pune from 12-12-2016 to 14-12-2016. 50 senior citizens attended this lecture series. 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Annexure - IV

ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN WITH SPONSOR SUPPORT

Apart from undertaking Educational Programmes every year for school / college students, adults and senior citizens with budgetary provisions of Bahishal Shikshan Mandal of Savitribai Phule Pune Vidyapeeth, the Institute with the support of sponsor implemented following programmes.

- 1) On 21st September 2013 in association with College of Agriculture, Pune (MPKV Rahuri Dist. Ahmednagar) the Institute arranged “Maharashtra Krishi Nirdhar Parishad” in the premises of College of Horticulture, Pune to discuss strategies for the next 5 years for Dry land Agriculture and small and marginal farmers of Maharashtra. This Parishad was sponsored by Dhanuka Agritech Limited and Sholapur Janata Sahakari Bank, Sholapur. 50 Scientists in Agriculture from all over Maharashtra attended the Parishad and deliberated on the topic and suggested ways and means to be adopted in dry land farming. Jalyukta Shivar and Shet-tali were recommended in the Parishad which has been implemented by the State Government. Apart from this, drip irrigation, change in cropping pattern, plantation of horticulture crops were some of the recommendations. The Institute spread this message of the Parishad subsequently throughout Maharashtra. Jawar and Tur cultivation by drip irrigation is one such example.



- 2) The Institute in association with Agriculture Dept. Maharashtra Govt. Ranjangaon Ganapati Deosthan Trust and Baburao Daundkar Smarak Samiti, Shirur organised one day seminar for farmers of Shirur Taluka in the premises of

Ranjangaon Deosthan Trust. This seminar was attended by 150 farmers and Scientists from State Govt., Professors from Agriculture College and reputed farmers from Shirur Taluka addressed the gathering and guided them on water conservation practices, plantation crops, medicinal crops etc. Prof. M. C. Varshneya, Dr. K. T. Galande, Shri. Temgire spoke on the occasion.



- 3) On carrying out survey of 6 villages of Shirur Taluka, Karanjwane village was selected for adoption for its overall development during next 10 years. The problems of the villagers were identified and prioritised. Since non availability of drinking water from January to May-June every year was the basic problem, it was decided to desilt the village pond (percolation tank) which was constructed by the State Govt. in the draught of 1972. Accordingly, a proposal was sent to Dist. Collector, Pune and CEO Z.P., Pune in April-May 2013 for an amount of Rs. 11 lakh. A sum of Rs. 6,43,792/- was sanctioned by Z.P., Pune for the purpose. Pending receipt of money from State Govt. the members of IRDE contributed Rs. 1,75,000/- and started the work. Desilting was done. Rest of the work is in progress.



- 4) Propaganda for Jowar and Tur cultivation with Drip Irrigation is done during 2014-15 and 2015-16 with the help of Agriculture Dept. of the State Govt. officials, by the members of IRDE by spending their own money on transport, lodging and boarding. Apart from that a sum of Rs. 20,000/- was given by the Institute to the

local supervisors who use to visit the fields of the farmers on regular basis during the cultivation season to supervise the adoption of cultivation practices recommended by the IRDE.

- 5) Distribution of Soil Health Card Project was implemented during the period April to June 2015 in association with Zooari Agrochemicals. Soil testing was done by them at a concessional rate of Rs. 50/- per sample and soil health card distribution. programme was organised by IRDE on sharing of expenditure by Zooari Agro Chemicals, IRDE and Kisan Sangh, Shirur.
- 6) The Book titled “India’s Perspective Policy On Agriculture” was published with the financial / infrastructural support of Navsari, Anand and Junagadh Agriculture Universities Gujarat, Adani Infrastructure, Gujarat and Uttan Krishi Sanshodan Kendra, Thane.



Annexure V

Need to raise Inland / foreign funds

- 1) The experience with regards to raising funds from CSR for undertaking various activities of the Institute is not satisfactory, hence the Institute has always sought ways for sponsorship and funds from other organisations. In current scenario CSR activity has become a business rather than a social activity. Institute has approached various organisations for funds as mentioned in Annexure IV.
- 2) Our Institute plans to work immensely on upbringing of rural youth and farmers. With some prodigious future plans (listed out in Annexure III) the Institute proposes to have its own land and building which will be used to carry out research activities like establishing soil testing and analysis lab, educating unemployed youth/women. Institute plans to conduct workshops/seminars and training courses on agriculture activities and other allied activities which will focus on skill development and self-employment.
- 3) The name of Institute speaks for itself “Institute of Rural Development and Education”, the Institute’s main objective is rural development. With the help of inland / foreign funds the Institute can achieve some rural development which will further help our country grow in fourfold way
- 4) The capital investment for raising such infrastructure is high. The Institute will keep on following up for funds from CSR activities.
- 5) In the present circumstances, the Institute lacks its own premises, back office support, infrastructure facilities.
- 6) The Institute is struggling hard to keep up with its primary work of adopting more villages and carrying out its various plans for rural development
- 7) The Institute is ready to shake hands with Indian companies for CSR funds like yours to fulfill its objectives and serve the nation in general and agricultural / rural community in particular so as to ensure reverse migration and stop farmer's suicide.
